Dear Parents and Guardians,

WOW! The first two months of school has finished and things seem to be going quite well. The students are making new friends, learning new things and enjoying their classes. We are seeing students following our Code of Conduct, being H.E.R.O.'s and our spaces are working out nicely for learning and teaching. I am extremely proud of our students during recess and lunch activities. The level of respect and empathy in our student population is encouraging. I would like to thank the staff who have been busy teaching, washing hands, interacting positively with all students and maintaining safety protocols. We had great learning activities in October and the month finished up with STEM activities, pizza making, cooking, and many fun-filled classroom activities for Halloween.

Our focus for the year will continue to be that everyone feel welcome, accepted, supported and respected. This will align with our Framework for Improvement and will target kindness and gratitude. Please see our mission statement and school goals below.

## Mission Statement for Margaret Ma Murray Community School We are a caring community. We create, we learn, we collaborate!

At MMMCS, our vision is to create a welcoming community that will provide creative, hands-on learning experiences. Students are empowered to become kind, inclusive, responsible, and curious lifelong learners.

At planning day on September 25<sup>th</sup>, the staff was involved in reviewing school goals, achievement and attendance data. We have set our goals for the year as follows:

- 1. To foster a community where everyone feels safe, respected, welcome and accepted.
- 2. To identify students' abilities and develop personalized opportunities for academic growth.
- 3. Provide a variety of engaging opportunities for students to develop ADST skills.

We noticed that as a result of us focusing on attendance, many of our students showed significant improvement in attendance, academics and a feeling of being accepted. Families often think that missing school in elementary, particularly in kindergarten and primary classes, will not

affect student learning. This, however, is a myth. It is true that everything you need to learn to be successful, you learn in kindergarten and carry through the rest of your life. Kindergarten

and primary classes provide the foundational skills and work habits that are necessary for further success in older grades. You can't learn if you can't read, get along with others, have socialization skills and good work habits. According to research, students who miss a significant amount of school, have difficulty with reading, writing, math and social skills. These students tend to fall behind in elementary school and have difficulty making friends which then causes stress and anxiety, increasing attendance issues.

We do understand that students will be staying home when they are sick or feel sick and have health symptoms according to the daily health check form. Our hope is that students maintain good attendance when they feel healthy. Being late, particularly when literacy and numeracy lessons are being taught, may be detrimental to how a student learns. Being late also impacts anxiety in students ~ many feel overwhelmed entering a class when instruction has begun.

Students know that we expect H.E.R.O. behaviour in our school: Honesty, Empathy, Responsible and being **Openminded** are encouraged and taught. Students receive firebird coins for showing expected behaviour around the school and are able to put their names in for our monthly pizza lunch draw. We had two pizza lunches this year and would like to congratulation the winners of the draws.

<u>P.A.C. Update</u>: New Fundraiser Alerts! Are you tired of trying to track down your child's personal items? Are you frustrated that they have lost another water bottle or a pair of shoes? We can help! We've started a fundraising campaign with Mabel's Labels. These labels are made in Canada and very durable. They also offer free shipping. <u>Canteen/Special Lunches</u>: School meals menus for November were sent home. If your child did not bring home the order form, please contact the school and we can add your child in. Canteen items will be sold every day and student orders will be taken in the morning in each class. We ask that exact change be submitted unless families want to send money to have a credit/tab. Hot lunch order is open for November. To sign up for this option, please visit:

http:mmmcs.hotlunches.net. The code is MMHL. To use the hot lunch option, orders must be paid for within a month or future orders will be put on hold. Once this happens, a new account will need to be set up.

Many students forget lunches in the business of getting ready for school. Students who forget lunches at home can request a school lunch from their classroom teacher. This will be provided

by our school meal program. It ensures that all student get lunch. Sometimes families get busy in the morning and children don't have time for breakfast or forget to eat. Students who need

breakfast or a snack can receive this at school as well. Please have your child check in with their teacher who will then provide a breakfast option. We have a fruit bowl in each pod and encourage students to help themselves responsibly to this fruit bowl. Options for breakfast will be provided in each pod. Options will include toast, cereal, fruit and yogurt. We receive donations through the year from many organizations who provide us with funds. We are grateful for these funds and will use them to support our breakfast program. We currently have grade 6 students helping to distribute breakfast items each morning as well as cleaning up cups and cutlery and loading the dishwasher. Thank you to Nathan and True for taking this one for the months of September and October.

<u>School Fees</u>: Thank you to all who have sent in their school fees. We will issue receipts as soon as possible. The office accepts cash or checks for fees and families can also use the online option for fee payment. Families who wish to pay by credit card can make a visit to Mrs. Gibos at the office who can process payment for you. We would appreciate all fees being paid by the end of November.

The weather in October was beautiful and the weather forecast looks promising for the first part of November. The temperature will be dropping outside and will continue to drop as the month progresses. Just a reminder that the students will be outside until the temperature is - 15. Students need to dress appropriately to stay outside for at least 15-20 minutes. We know that families are providing adequate clothing and that the students, sometimes are choosing not to wear items outside. A friendly reminder from home may help students understand that in order to stay warm, they need to wear their outdoor clothes. Families who require assistance with winter clothes can let the teacher know. The school will look to help outfit children in need.

<u>Parking Lot:</u> There daily concerns about the parking lot and entryway of the school. Please remember that it is important to keep all students safe upon arrival and pick up. Vehicles that are parking to drop off are reminded to stay in the drop off zone, not bus zone or in the staff parking lot. This is equally important after school as there are 5 buses to pick up our students, there will be a district band bus daily. When leaving the parking lot, please make sure to stop before entering 105<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The staff will also be reviewing rules for road safety with students that walk home. We would appreciate all students using the crosswalks and if all could remain on sidewalks. Families are also encouraged to park along 105<sup>th</sup> Avenue to avoid the parking lot nightmare. Having students walk out to this area should be safe.

<u>Fundraising</u>: Fundraising season has begun. Thank you to all families and friends who supported the "Fresh to You" fundraiser. We will be receiving these orders near the end of November. As part of this fundraiser, B.C. farmers match every bundle sold with a bundle to give to our community. We sold 180 bundles which means 180 bundles of free produce. This is equivalent to 1600 kg (3600 pound) of produce that we will be able to gift to needy people in our community. Last year we supported veterans, seniors, the women's resource center and the friendship center along with families at the elementary schools in Fort St. John.
